Why do we do it?



Build's your child's auditory memory skills.



Helps foster complexity of language, vocabulary growth, and conversational skills.

Example Scenarios:



Child: "Baby cry"

Parent: "I hear the baby crying. Maybe she is hungry."



Child: "My train is blue"

Parent: "Your large train is blue with tiny black wheels."



Infant: coos and reaches for book.

Parent: "Yes, let's read your favorite book about the gorilla at the zoo."



Child: "The plant get bigger."

Parent: "Yes, the plant grew taller by three inches."
